THE WGI JUDGING PROCESS

WGI judges have undergone rigorous training to prepare them for today's event. Each performing group is awarded a total score from a possible 100 points.

GENERAL EFFECT (40 POINTS)

General Effect judges reward the overall effectiveness of the show's designed moments as well as the performers communication of the show. Effects can be intellectual, emotional, or aesthetic. This caption is about the whole package and how it is brought to life through the performance.

DESIGN ANALYSIS (20 POINTS)

Design judges analyze the quality of the design and the depth of the composition of the program as a whole. Technical and expressive excellence is given special consideration. A close look is given to each moment in time and how it connects to the entirety of the program.

EQUIPMENT (20 POINTS)

Equipment judges analyze the range and depth of the choreographic efforts focusing on the flags, rifles, sabres, or other props being manipulated.

MOVEMENT (20 POINTS)

Movement judges analyze the range and depth of the movement choreography while dancing as well as the movement considerations while manipulating the equipment and props. Special consideration is made regarding the training, excellence, and achievement of the performers, as well as the uniformity from performer to performer.
